Introduction

Introduction to the Assessment Plan for the Academy of Hotel and Facility Management 2025-2026

The Assessment Plan is an integral part of the Teaching and Exam Regulations (TER) for the academic year 2025-2026 at the Academy of Hotel and Facility Management (AHF). This document provides a comprehensive overview of the various assessments that students will undertake throughout their study program.

The plan details the types of assessments, the number of credits each assessment carries, the type of value assigned (e.g., grade or pass/fail), the minimum required grades, and the weight of each assessment in the overall evaluation. This structured approach ensures transparency and clarity, helping students understand the expectations and requirements for successful completion of their courses.

The Assessment Plan is organized into the following categories:

- **Hotel Management and Facility Management**: This section covers the specific assessments related to each field, ensuring that students are evaluated on relevant competencies and skills.
- **Tracks**: The plan is further divided into three distinct tracks to cater to the diverse educational backgrounds of the students:
 - o **Regular track (Track 1)**: Designed for students following the standard curriculum.
 - **Pre-university track (Track 2)**: Tailored for students who have completed pre-university education.
 - o **MBO-HBO track (Track 3)**: For students transitioning from vocational (MBO) to higher professional education (HBO).

Additionally, the plan distinguishes between students who started their studies in 2024 or earlier and those who commenced in 2025. This differentiation ensures that all students are assessed according to the regulations and standards applicable to their cohort.

Since parts of the program are offered on an alternating basis, the sequence in which the various courses are followed may differ. This flexibility accommodates the diverse needs and schedules of the students, ensuring that all required competencies are met regardless of the order in which courses are taken

The Assessment Plan serves as a valuable guide throughout the academic journey, providing clear insights into the evaluation process and helping students achieve their educational goals.

1.1 Practical exercises and attendance requirement

- The examiner can only assess the learning process or progress of the learning activity through observation.
- The student is dependent on the personal presence of fellow students and vice versa for their learning process or progress of the learning activity.
- The student is dependent on interaction with representatives of the hotel or facility management field for their learning process or progress of the learning activity.

If attendance is part of the assessment, the student's attendance will be evaluated at the level of a partial exam. When the student has been insufficiently present and/or insufficiently prepared and/or has not sufficiently participated during the learning activity, the student does not meet the requirement and will not receive a 'Pass'. The student's attendance is recorded in the Digital Learning Environment, where the content and criteria for the additional assignment per study unit are also communicated.
